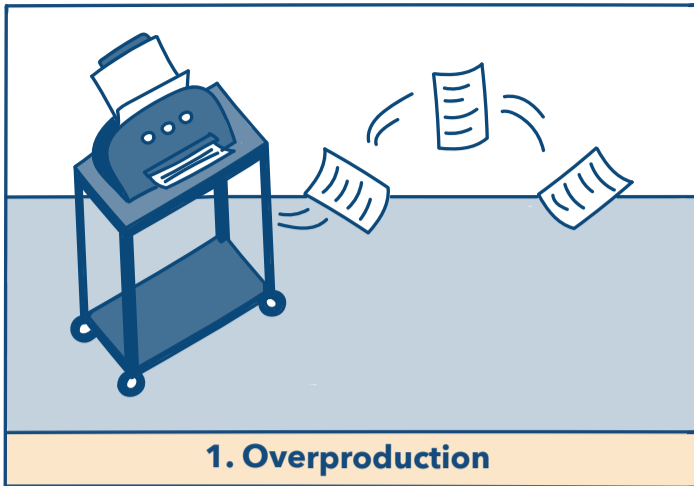
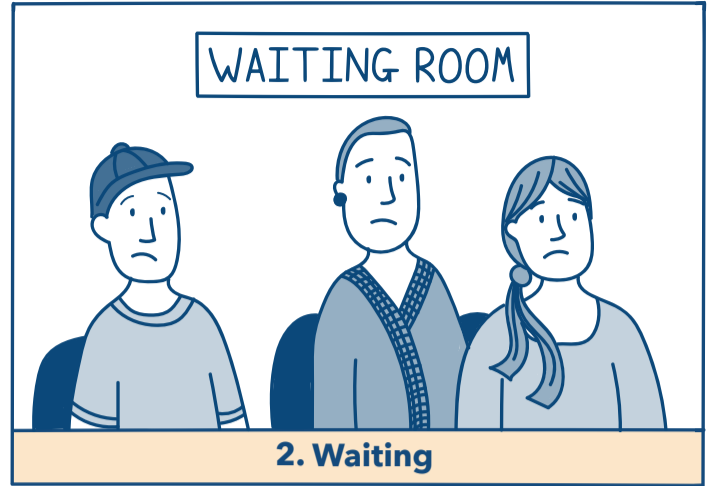


7 Wastes - Hospice Examples



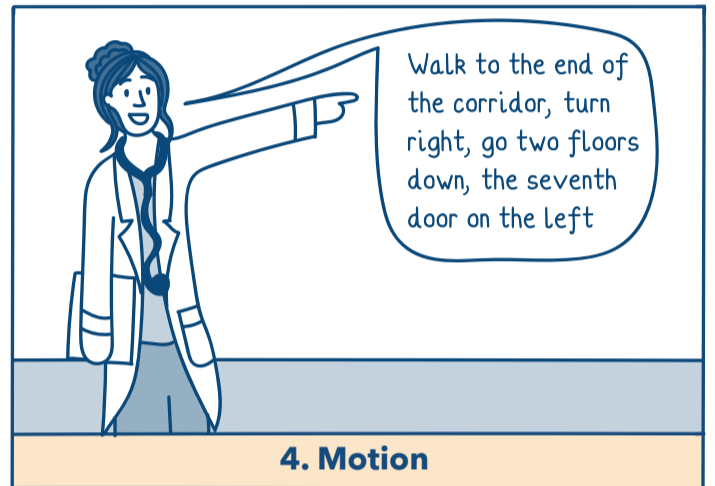
Printing excessive copies of paperwork, forms, or patient records that are not required.



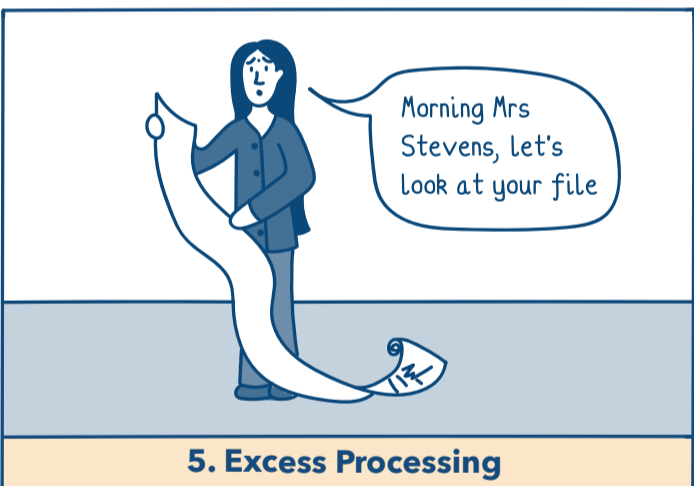
Delays in patient admissions, transfers, or test results due to inefficient scheduling or coordination.



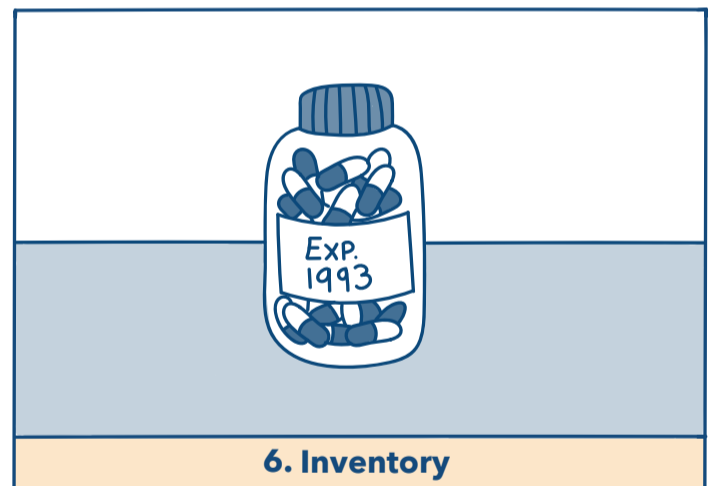
Errors or mistakes in medication administration, documentation, or patient care that require corrective actions, rework, or additional resources.



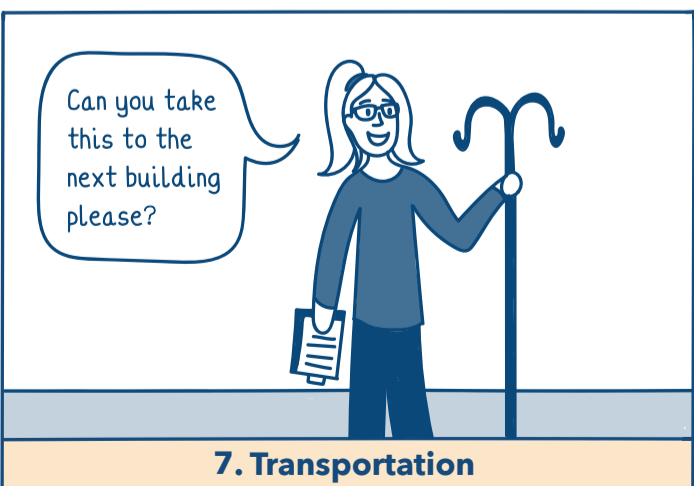
Staff members walking excessively within the hospice due to inefficient layout or inadequate accessibility to necessary equipment or supplies.



Performing redundant or unnecessary administrative tasks, such as excessive documentation or redundant data entry.



Accumulating excess inventory of medical supplies or medications beyond what is required for immediate patient care.



Frequent movement of medical supplies, equipment, or medication across different areas of the hospice due to poor layout or lack of proper storage.

7 Wastes

Waste is anything that does NOT add value to your product or service. Every activity in your organisation either adds customer value, or cost (Waste). Reducing waste allows your team to spend more time on meeting customer requirements.
